The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs: The pool of students designated to receive the HEERF II Student Grant was all currently enrolled TBC students as of December 17, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. (the "Cutoff Date"), and all graduates from TBC starting from September 15, 2021 through the Cutoff Date. Eligible students did not include students who had withdrawn or been terminated from the program. The begin date of distribution to all eligible students and graduates was Tuesday, December 21, 2021 [Houston campuses] and Wednesday, December 22, 2021 [Dallas campuses]. The distribution of HEERF II funds amongst all eligible students and graduates was even, but students and graduates who did not qualify for PELL grants had their distribution reduced by \$250, thereby prioritizing students with exceptional need (i.e., PELL grant recipients). Students and graduates who qualified for PELL grants received checks in the amount of \$1,436.50 each, and those who did not qualify for PELL grants received checks in the amount of \$1,186.50 each.

Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants: Eligible students and graduates were advised that on December 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) was signed into law. The CRRSAA authorized schools to distribute more Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) grant monies to students. CRRSAA funds are intended for any component of a student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to COVID-19, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or child care. Eligible students and graduates were notified via email and text as to the time and place for picking up their CRRSAA checks.

The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs: On or about December 17, 2021, \$594,080.00 in HEERF II student grant funds was distributed to eligible TBC students and graduates (the "1<sup>st</sup> Round – HEERF II Distribution"), leaving \$10,000.00 in HEERF II student grant funds for distribution on February 1, 2022 (the "2<sup>nd</sup> Round – HEERF II Distribution"). The pool of students designated to receive the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round – HEERF II Distribution was all students and graduates who received HEERF II grant funds in the 1<sup>st</sup> Round – HEERF II Distribution plus newly enrolled students and graduates since the 1<sup>st</sup> Round – HEERF II Distribution through January 25, 2022. Eligible students did not include students who had withdrawn or been terminated from the program. The distribution of HEERF II funds amongst all eligible students and graduates was even, but students and graduates who did not qualify for PELL grants had their distribution reduced by \$3.97 (17.40% of \$22.80, which was the amount distributed to PELL students/graduates), thereby prioritizing students with exceptional need (i.e., PELL grant recipients).

Students were further advised that CRRSAA funds are intended for any component of a student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to COVID-19, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or child care.
